Currently, the app starts with the questionnaires, but there is no global navigation menu that would enable the user to do some breathing exercises without completing the surveys. A main screen with different buttons for surveys, exercises, specialists, and profile info could be useful.

A global navigation menu was added that users see before the survey option to allow direct access to the breathing exercises page.
